

The Bible was the first book in history to be printed. Johann Gutenberg invented the printing press in Mainz, Germany in 1455. Up until this time if a book was to be copied, it had to be done by hand. The Gutenberg Printing Press allowed copies to be mass produced with the help of the movable type (see picture below).

As the Bible was copied and shared it became a source of inspiration and hope to many people. Words like those found in Joshua 1:9 have provided inspiration and encouragement have inspired millions of people: "Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go." That's just one sentence in a massive story which gives encouragement now and hope for the future.

WHAT'S ON? CAMPUS CHURCH


Every Saturday morning we gather as a church community in the NCC chapel. This is open to everyone and we hope you will feel comfortable to join us at any time.




Year 11 Biology
