It's wonderful to see that compassion is a core value being emphasized in our school community over the next few weeks. Compassion is indeed a powerful and essential virtue that can make a significant difference in the lives of others.

It may be easier to show compassion to those we know and love but extending it to strangers or individuals with a negative attitude can be more challenging. However, it is precisely in these situations that true compassion shines, as it demonstrates genuine care and empathy for all human beings.

The definition of compassion from the dictionary aligns well with the concept of sensitivity and concern for the suffering of others. It involves both emotional understanding and taking action to alleviate their pain. The three forms of compassion described by Dr. Paul Ekman (2023) - 'empathic compassion (focusing on the feeling the emotions experienced by the person who is suffering), action compassion (focusing on actions that attempt to relieve physical and emotional pain), and concerned compassion (concern for the person who is suffering, emphasising the compassionate person's motivation to alleviate suffering)' - provide a well-rounded approach to practicing this virtue.

The recent loss experienced within our NCC family has brought forth a heartwarming display of compassion within the school community. Such moments remind us of the preciousness of life and the importance of treasuring and cherishing our loved ones. The following Bible verses reinforce the value of compassion and love for one another, encouraging a sense of unity and kindness among the students.

1 Peter 3:8 'Finally, all of you, be like-minded, be sympathetic, love one another, be compassionate and humble.'

John 13:34-35 highlights 'So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other. Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples.'

Lamentations 3:22-23 'Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.'




