After the rocks were set up, the ochre was made by chipping a piece off the rock, using a hammer to crush it, then grinding that with another rock to make a fine powder. Water was then added which created a paste. More water was added to then create a slurry to use to paint or draw.


This term she will be teaching Year 7 and Year 10 Mathematics and Science and Year 8 Mathematics.




## Year 9 Science
